March 25, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>hears from West Virginia Counties</u>, County Commissioners, Municipal Leagues, Sheriffs, and the Economic Development Council to hear their concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

March 24, 2020 – Senator Manchin announced \$1.5 million to <u>help communities provide meals</u> for older West Virginians.

March 24, 2020 – Senator Manchin collaborated with United Way and others to encourage West Virginians to sew medical masks for healthcare workers in West Virginia.

March 24, 2020 – Senator Manchin participated in a call with the <u>West Virginia Manufacturers</u> <u>Association</u> to hear their concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

March 23, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>introduced two bills</u> to require the full use of the Defense Production Act (DPA) to produce these supplies. Both bills would require the President to use his full authority to quickly produce and ensure access to supplies, including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), for healthcare professionals and those on the front lines of the COVID-19 outbreak.

March 23, 2020 – Senator Manchin spoke on the Senate Floor about the lack of adequate funding to protect healthcare professionals as they fight on the front lines of the COVID-19 outbreak in the Republican proposal for the third coronavirus funding package.

March 23, 2020 – Senator Manchin urged West Virginians to <u>listen to the stay-at-home order</u> from Governor Justice to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

March 22, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>sent a letter</u> to the Senate Appropriations Committee to secure funding for hotspots to help those in areas with unreliable broadband, such as students impacted by school closures.

March 22, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>voted against moving forward</u> with the Republican proposal for the third funding package because it did not improve our ability to treat COVID-19, protect those on the front lines, help hard working Americans, or support small businesses.

March 22, 2020 – Senator Manchin spoke with the Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases Dr. Anthony Fauci, who shared concrete steps to slow the COVID-19 outbreak.

March 21, 2020 - Senator Manchin requested an <u>update from the federal coronavirus taskforce</u> on the stockpiles of medical supplies to equip West Virginia healthcare professionals with what they need to stay safe as they fight this pandemic.

March 21, 2020 – Senator Manchin participated in a call with the <u>West Virginia American</u> <u>Federation of Teachers</u> about their concerns during the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

March 21, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>called on West Virginian's</u> who are able to support the medical professional community by making desperately needed medical supplies.

March 20, 2020 - Senator Manchin <u>participated in separate calls</u> with the West Virginia Hospital Association, the West Virginia Chamber of Commerce, and the West Virginia Directors for Senior and Community Services to hear their concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

March 19, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>sent a letter</u> to the Senate Appropriations Committee to temporarily lift the cap on public services within the Community Development Block Grant fund, which would allow this funding to be used for services such as Meals on Wheels or lunches for students impacted by school closures.

March 19, 2020 - Senator Manchin <u>participated in separate calls</u> with the West Virginia Nursing Association and the West Virginia State Medical Association to hear their concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

March 19, 2020 - Senator Manchin secured a <u>commitment from Fairmont Regional Medical</u>
<u>Center</u> they would maintain the facility's pristine condition when closing so it could easily be reopened should it need to be. He also received a commitment from West Virginia University to open the facility should it need to be.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin advocated for Fairmont Regional Medical Center (FRMC) to stay open during the COVID-19 pandemic.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin voted for *Families First Coronavirus Response Act* which passed the Senate with a vote of 90-8.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>participated in a call</u> with the West Virginia Hospitality and Travel Association to hear their concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>pressed the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Secretary</u> Robert Wilkie on the VA's plans and preparations for the coronavirus outbreak that will disproportionately affect many Veterans.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin spoke on the Senate Floor on the need to support West Virginians at risk during the coronavirus outbreak.

March 18, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>urged that any emergency funding</u> must focus on medical research and supporting American workers and small businesses.

March 17, 2020 – Senator Manchin released a statement on the <u>first confirmed COVID-19 case</u> in West Virginia in the Eastern Panhandle and on Governor Justice's decision to close restaurants, bars, and casinos while allowing carry out options.

March 17, 2020 – Senator Manchin announced \$5.5 million for <u>coronavirus response</u> across West Virginia from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) through the CARES Act.

March 17, 2020 – Senator Manchin secured a commitment from Dr. Stephen Hahn, the Commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to expedite COVID-19 testing to West Virginia.

March 17, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>urged the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services</u> (HHS) Secretary Alex Azar and Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response Robert

Kadlec to provide personal protective equipment (PPEs) which includes gloves, gowns, face shields, and masks, to the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources (DHHR) for the coronavirus outbreak response.

March 16, 2020 – Senator Manchin spoke on the Senate Floor to urge the Senate to act immediately on emergency coronavirus funding, which had already been passed by the House of Representatives.

March 13, 2020 – Senator Manchin released a statement on the <u>closure of schools</u> in West Virginia.

March 13, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>successfully advocated</u> for the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to approve West Virginia's application to provide meals to students during the coronavirus outbreak if schools closed.

March 12, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>urged West Virginians</u> to exercise caution as the coronavirus spread throughout the United States.

March 5, 2020 – Senator Manchin applauded the Senate's <u>approval of \$8.3 billion</u> in emergency supplemental funding, including \$500 million in Medicare funds, to prepare and respond to the coronavirus outbreak.

March 3, 2020 – Senator Manchin <u>announced</u> a <u>coronavirus resource page on his website</u> to ensure West Virginians have access to accurate information so they can be prepared and safe.
