3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Rural Post Office Re-
5	construction Act of 2023".

16	disaster—
17	"(A) if the damaged rural post office be-
18	comes inoperable or suffers irreparable damage
19	on or after the date of enactment of this sec-
20	tion, not later than 90 days after the date of
21	such inoperability or irreparable damage; and
22	"(B) if the damaged rural post office be-
23	came inoperable or suffered irreparable damage
24	not more than 2 years before the date of enact-

3	"(2) Exception.—The Postal Service shall
4	delay reconstruction of a damaged rural post office
5	under paragraph (1) if individuals directly involved
6	with the reconstruction will be subject to physical in-

9	uals to proceed with the reconstruction.
10	"(c) Restoration of Suspended Operation.—
11	The Postal Service, in consultation with the Administrator
12	of General Services, shall secure a suitable replacement
13	lease or rental agreement for a suspended rural post of-
14	fice—
15	"(1) if the suspended rural post office suspends
16	operation on or after the date of enactment of this
17	section, not later than 90 days after the date of sus-
18	pension of operation; and
19	"(2) if the suspended rural post office sus-
20	pended operation not more than 2 years before the
21	date of enactment of this section, not later than 90
22	days after the date of such enactment.
23	"(d) Report Required.—If the Postal Service does
24	not execute the measures described in subsection (b) or
25	(c) within the time period required under the applicable
