On Thursday, January 25, 2024 the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) will be holding a hearing entitled: "Why does the United States pay, by far, the highest prices in the world for prescription drugs?"

We are writing to formally invite you to this hearing so that the Committee can better understand how Johnson & Johnson determines the price of prescription drugs in the United States and throughout the world and how the high price of medicine in our country is impacting the health and well-being of the American people.

The HELP Committee has jurisdiction over matters related to public health and biomedical research and development. Please submit a written statement of any length prior to the hearing for inclusion in the hearing record. At the hearing, you will be given five minutes to summarize your written testimony. Each Senator will then have five minutes to ask questions of witnesses.


